I. Panther Camp

- A. Fundraising for scholarships and giveaways
 - 1. Registration fee for camp is \$90
 - 2. With scholarship, decreases fee to \$40
 - 3. Work with Panther pride office
 - 4. Goal is to eliminate external factors that prevent student from attending
 - 5. Fundraising goal for 2019 is \$15,000
 - 6. Monetary donation: go.fiu.edu/pcgive

B. Sessions

- 1. June 21-23 for Freshman
- 2. July 19-21 for Transfers
- 3. August 19-21 for Freshman and Transfers
- 4. Session also in January
- 5. 350 students in total
- 6. Transfers eligible within 1 year of coming to FIU

II. Transfer and Transitions

- A. Bill in Tallahassee
 - 1. 2 year graduate rate metric for 2+2 students
 - 2. Need to work with partner institutions; target MDC and BC to work with transitioning students
 - 3. Based on FSU's work with transfer students (41% graduation rate within 2 years)
 - 4. Task force to be created to focus on preparing these students
- B. Many class equivalencies now automated; student agreements not yet automated (soon to be part of PSN)
- C. FIU part of top 10 nationwide for transfer student enrollment (not graduation)
- D. Exploratory not an option for transfers with over 60 credits
 - 1. Early communication is key
 - 2. Policies in majors/colleges shared early on
- E. Do not call TCPC directly- staff is working on processing and needs to focus
- F. Second Annual Transfer Summit
 - 1. October 28th at UCF
 - 2. Hosted by Florida Consortium (FIU, UCF, USF)
- G. Ideas Shared
 - 1. Coordination efforts between colleges such as Nursing with CASE

- 2. Cross train advisors within colleges
- 3. Allow change of majors at Love My Major event

- A. Fluid available for orientation
 - 1. Access to register via mobile devices
 - 2. System uses tiles not links
 - 3. Peer Advisors will be trained on it
 - 4. Reminder to register for professional advisors meeting (4/29)
 - 5. Request for more advisors in the rooms during advisement as attendees will stay in the room
 - 6. Class search is most difficult part; list created to help students select courses (i.e. Early Fall English).

- 1. 4156 students contacted with last campaign, 1661 attended meeting with advisor, 1300 enrolled
- 2. In May and August, advisors to contact students not enrolled (report template to come)
- 3. Remember to match appointments with campaigns
- 4. Request for percentages of goal attained by college

C. Orientation

- 1. Students to come in with shopping cart on mobile device
- 2. Students all remain in room during advisement; will need to organize the room appropriately
