II. Preliminary Degree Check

- For those with 90 credit holds, Program/Plan changes beyond that 90 credit threshold requires Dean's approval (or Designee)
- RDX positive service indicators will be used to designate that student has met with advisor, PDC hold was removed and that n further changes to Program/Plan can be made after that point. The indicator will not affect enrollment.
- Students that previously had PDC hold will not receive it again nor will those beyond threshold that may not have received it before. These accounts will also be notated with an RDX positive service indicator.

III. Change of Major Memo- Kevin Coughlin

- o Form (exception)? A special form to change majors after 90 credits. Without having to do the standard form and an added memo.
- O Dean's/designee signature: form with a checklist that lists the only two reasons that a major can be changed.
- Connie: ECS report being sent to Kevin on looking at the majors in CASE with excess hours. The student populations between Interdisciplinary studies and Bio/Chem are very different and accrue excess credit in different ways.

VII. Subcommittee Updates

- Policy- By-laws will be updated to reflect integrations; use will expand, specifically, to advising policy issues to include all advising leads from Colleges/Schools; goal to use forum to make decisions with all-unit input; also discussing redirection, readmission/reinstatements, and across-unit cooperation/collaboration/interaction, at-risk student early intervention,
 - Question from TTS about when STEM students are redirected.

 Engineering: first semester FTIC hold before grades posts, then follow-up outreach; basic convo first semester; second semester stronger intervention. When a student no longer wants to major in Engineering, they are asked to go see a different advisor, and once that happens, the hold will be removed. CASE: with smaller caseloads, the interventions are happening sooner. Advisors are more empowered to work more proactively with students as they have more teeth through policy and paradigm shift. Exploring more expansive interventions. Korrin-Peer advisors can be trained to deliver the student message to science majors at orientations
