

## **HAZING PREVENTION RESOURCE GUIDE**

#### What is hazing?

Hazing refers to any action or situation, which occurs on or off university property, that recklessly or intentionally endangers the mental or physical health or safety of an individual for purposes including, but not limited to, initiation, admission into, affiliation with, or the perpetuation or furtherance of a tradition or ritual of any university student organization or group whether or not officially recognized by the university.

#### Hazing includes, but is not limited to:

- Pressuring or coercing an individual to violate state or federal law.
- Acts of physical brutality such as whipping, beating, branding, exposure to the elements, or forced consumption of food, liquor, drugs, or other substances.
- Forced physical activity that could adversely affect an individual's health or safety.
- Activities that subject an individual to extreme mental stress, such as sleep deprivation, exclusion from social contact, conduct that results in extreme embarrassment, or other actions that could undermine an individual's mental health or dignity.

Hazing does not include customary athletic events or other similar contests or competitions or any activity or conduct that furthers a legal and legitimate objective.
